Terry approved the design of Death dancing with Miss Flitworth (on the left) but when we started production, it was found to be pretty impossible to paint under Miss Flitworth’s skirt. The skirt was lengthened slightly and most of the figures sold are as on the right; however, there is a small batch of about 19 ‘short skirts’ somewhere out there which are quite rare and sought after.
